
Thank you all for your unwavering support and dedication. Together, let's continue to make a positive impact and uphold the values that define our American Legion Post.






Blue Star Service Banner About The Flag

- ➤ The Blue Star Service Banner was designed and patented in 1917 by World War I Army Capt. Robert L. Queissner of the 5th Ohio Infantry who had two sons serving on the front line. It quickly became the unofficial symbol of a child in the service.
- ➤ On Sept. 24, 1917, an Ohio congressman read the following into the Congressional Record: "...The mayor of Cleveland, the Chamber of Commerce and the governor of Ohio have adopted this service flag. The world should know of those who give so much for liberty. The dearest thing in all the world to a father and mother their children."
- > During World War II, the Department of War issued specifications on the manufacture of the flag as well as guidelines indicating when and by whom the Service flag could be flown or the Service Lapel button

could be worn. The Depart-guidelines on December 1, which implemented an Act of flag and a service lapel button was cancelled by DoD in 1970 1348.33-M, Manual of Military transferring cognizance to the current guidance for the manuservice flag and service lapel federal law. (36 U.S.C. 179 –

➤ The Blue Star Service Banner

- > The banner displayed in the front window of a home shows a family's pride in their loved one serving in the military, and reminds others that preserving America's freedom demands much.
- The blue star represents one family member serving in the armed forces. A banner can have up to five stars, signifying that five members of that family are currently in military uniform on active duty.
- If the individual symbolized is killed or dies while serving the star representing that individual will have superimposed on it a gold star of smaller size so that the blue forms a border. On flags displaying multiple stars, including gold stars, when the flags are suspended as against a wall, the gold star(s) will be to the right of, or above the blue star(s) a place of honor nearest the staff.
- ➤ Blue Star Mothers and Gold Star Mothers organizations were established during World War I and remain today.

What is VA Disability Compensation?

VA disability compensation is a tax-free benefit paid to Veterans who have a service-connected condition. A service-connected condition is an illness or injury that was caused by, or made worse by your active military service.

What are the elements of service-connection?

To qualify for service-connection, you must have served on active duty and have an Honorable or General (Under Honorable Conditions) characterization of service.

You must also have the following:

- 1. An event in service. This can be shown through service treatment record (STR) entries showing you received treatment while on active duty or other evidence such as receipt of combat medals,
- 2. A current diagnosis of the condition you are claiming, and
- 3. A link between the event in service and the current diagnosis.

Cary usually has their annual Veterans Experience Action Center (VEAC) in March. Start preparing now and get your claims in. More to follow as we get updated information.

If a skin medicine, prosthetic, or orthopedic device related to your service-connected disability damages your clothes, VBA may pay you to replace the damaged clothes. You'll need to submit your application on or before August 1, 2024, to get a clothing allowance for this year.
