My last couple of items are most important, Membership and Volunteering, I really want to thank all of our membership committees, Post 116 is at a record membership, 1134 Legionnaires, 333 Auxiliary and 226 Sons at the end of 2023-2024.

All were way over 100% for last year. Many thanks to everyone who helped. We are still the largest Post in N.C. by far, the next closest to us is not even at 700 members. Our volunteers are the best but we always need more.

Besides our bartenders we only have two employees. The Bar Manager and Rentals Manager, and their jobs do not include everything that has to be done to keep the post looking nice and events happening. Everything at the Post is run by Committees and done by volunteers. As a member we need your help even with little things such while at an event or anytime you see a garbage can full, please empty it, see a spilled drink help clean it up, if you see trash in the parking lot or around the Post please pick it up. If you have time bring a blower and blow off the patio, clean off tables anything to help out. If you don't know where garbage bags or cleaning supplies are please ask. Our events are growing in size and if you have the time please come out and help. We do have fun at our events and team work makes things all the better. Monika Jaymes will be performing August 24th from 7–10 & Party Rowdy on the 31st from 7-10.







Returning to civilian life from the military can be a difficult transition. This peer support group provides our Veterans a private space amungst peers to share their experiences or struggles.




