We have a bunch of events planned, stop by the rec room and have a drink and while you're at it, buy a friend a drink chip.

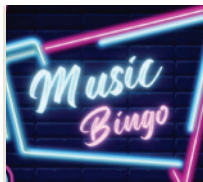

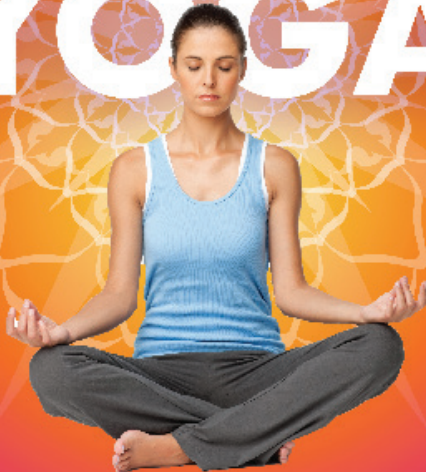
