A suicide bombing took place at Hamid Karzai International airport in Kabul, Afghanistan, on 26 August 2021, at 17:50 local time, during the evacuation from Afghanistan. At least 183 people were killed, including 170 Afghan civilians and 13 members of the United States military, the first American military casualties in the War in Afghanistan since February 2020. On 26 Aug 24 the post honored the 13 American soldiers who paid the ultimate sacrifice for our county by honoring them a table set up displaying their pictures, names and 13 shots.
